



NEBOSH National Certificate in Fire Safety and Risk Management

Introduction

The NEBOSH National Certificate in Fire Safety and Risk Management is a qualification for those with fire safety responsibilities in the workplace. The syllabus has been mapped against the 'Company Criteria for Fire Risk Assessors' which has been produced by the Fire Risk Assessment Competency Council.

This qualification should equip holders to carry out fire risk assessments of most low risk workplaces, and identify the range of fire protective and preventative measures required.

Course Duration

This course involves 13 days face-to-face tutoring, plus practical and written exams or 6 days for delegates who already hold a valid NGC1 qualification (taken in the last five years).

In addition to classroom based study, delegates will be expected to undertake a minimum of 51 hours of private study or 28 hours for those who already hold a valid NGC1 qualification.

Who Should Attend

This course has been specifically designed for those who need to ensure that their organisation meets its responsibilities under fire safety legislation.

This will include:

- Managers with a responsibility for fire safety in the workplace
- Those working in facilities management
- Employee representatives and others
- Those persons wishing to start a career in fire safety or occupational safety and health

Professional Membership

Holders of the NEBOSH National Certificate in Fire Safety and Risk Management qualification meets the academic requirements for Technical membership (Tech IOSH) of the Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH -www.iosh.co.uk) and Associate membership (AIIRSM) of the international Institute of Risk and Safety Management (IIRSM-www.iirsm.org).

Additionally, holders of this award are entitled to Technical membership (TIFPO) of the Institute of Fire Prevention Officers (IFPO). Qualification holders with the relevant skills and experience may also apply to join the IFPO Fire Risk Assessors Register.
