Health and safety law requires that organisations ensure a safe working environment for their employees, and those of other employers working on their premises, sites or in their name.

In the unfortunate event of an accident involving a contractor, questions will be asked of both the client and the contractor regarding how the safety of those activities were managed

- Control of contractor operations – site rules, induction, risk assessment and safe working procedures
- Monitoring of contractor activities onsite – supervision and permits to work
