Introduction

Health and safety legislation demands that employers make a suitable and sufficient assessment of:

- the risks to the health and safety of his employees to which they are exposed whilst they are at work
- the risks to the health and safety of persons not in his employment.

Those carrying out risk assessments must be competent to do so and all assessments must be documented if there are five or more employees in the company. The results of these risk assessments must then be communicated to the relevant persons. For employees, method statements and safe working procedures are an important part of this communication process.

This course is aimed at managers, supervisors, safety representatives or any other person with the responsibility of carrying out risk assessments. There are no pre-requisites for delegates attending this training course however a basic knowledge of general health and safety would be an advantage.
